

Leashes interfere with natural dog-dog interaction by preventing the dogs from having a choice on amount of personal space, inhibiting natural movement, as well as creating tension for the dog
Which leads to.....
o Crude Behavior. Dog comes on too strong
(Supermotivated through deprivation) when meeting other dogs and has poor social skills, which leads to....
o Owner alarmed by intensity. Keeps leash tight. Minimizes interaction time and/or avoids dogs (because "he gets too excited"), which leads to....
o Motivation up, social skills same: scuffles with irritated/defensive other dogs, which leads to....
o Owner more alarmed by scuffles, admonishes dog and "tries to control him" when approaching dogs by having a tight leash and/or punishment, which leads to....
o Barrier frustration and classical conditioning: dogs equal frustration/punishment, which leads to....
o Aggression towards other dogs, still no development of social skills, which leads to....
o TOTAL isolation or escalated punishment, which leads to....
o More social erosion and generalized aggression toward other dogs.
